Principal's Report




Dear Parent / Carers

School in Term 4, 2020

In accordance with advice from <u>NSW HealthExternal link</u>, parents and carers are reminded **NOT** to send children to school if they are unwell, even if they have the mildest flulike symptoms.

NSW Health has requested that schools encourage anyone who is unwell or has even mild flu-like symptoms, to arrange to be tested through their local medical practitioner or one of the <u>COVID-19 clinicsExternal link</u>.

Students and staff with flu-like symptoms will need to be tested and provide a copy of a negative COVID-19 test result and be symptoms free before being permitted to return to school.


Students who do not undertake a COVID-19 test result will not be permitted to return to school for a 10 day period. Additionally, they must be symptom free for at least 3 days prior to returning to school.

Students who have seasonal allergic rhinitis or another condition that presents similarly to flu-like symptoms are still required to get tested for COVID-19 and return a negative test result. Where their symptoms continue beyond 10 days, students should provide documentation from their GP confirming their symptoms are typical for their condition. If the student develops new or changed symptoms, they should get tested for COVID-19.

Students feeling unwell.

At times, students begin to feel unwell whilst at school and feel they need to go home. If a student feels unwell, it is important that they inform their teacher, and with permission, go to the front office, where they may be placed into sickbay for a short period of time. If students feel better they will be sent back to class, however, if there is no improvement, parents will be called by a Deputy Principal or our SASS staff. It is important to note that students should not be contacting their parents to pick them up if they are feeling unwell. Phone calls home must be made by designated staff at Parramatta High School to ensure the safety of our students. Thank you for your understanding in this matter.



CAREERS NEWS

Dear Parents/Guardians.

There was an excellent article in the Sun herald Last Sunday and I would like to raise a few points from the article.

The Federal government recently changed how it funds universities to teach domestic students, hoping to encourage more students to study certain fields where there are favourable job opportunities. From January 1, 2021 the cost of some degrees will rise significantly, whilst others will decrease.

If you decide to study Humanities, Law, Economics or communications, you will pay more. Fees for Humanities and Communications subjects will rise 113 %! Law, Commerce and Economics will rise 28%. A full four year program in these disciplines will cost \$58,000. Wow!

Degrees in Teaching, Nursing, Clinical Psychology, English and Languages will become up to 42% cheaper. For example, a three year nursing degree will cost \$11.850 down from \$20,412.

Architecture and Maths will become 59% cheaper. Science, Health, Architecture, Environment Science, IT and Engineering will be up to 18% cheaper. Fees for Medicine, Dental and Vet Science degrees will remain relatively the same.

If students are already enrolled in a degree where course fees are set to rise. E.g. law, the changes will not apply to them. However, students who are part-way through the courses which will become cheaper, such as nursing and engineering, will benefit from the lower fees.

Australian university students are charged fees per unit of course/subject, rather than the overall degree. Each semester, students receive a statement outlining how much they owe, and they can pay them up front or most students elect to defer their fees through HELP (Higher Education Loan program). Some subjects have higher fees than others and how much a degree costs will, therefore, depend on what subjects the students study in that degree.

Most domestic students enrolled in Bachelor degrees at Australia's 37 public universities have a Commonwealth Supported Place. That means that the government subsidises the cost of the course, leaving the students to pay the balance. The Herald provides an example that to study a full year of an arts degree (8 subjects), this year students were charged \$6684 in fees while the government picked up the rest of the tab \$6116. In 2021 students will be charge \$14,500 for one year of an arts degree while the government portion will fall to \$1100.

The aim of all this is to try and get more students into STEM related careers or careers where there are shortfalls in the workforce.

Whether this will be successful or not is debatable. Experts say that governments have done this in the past and there is little evidence that it has worked as students don't seem to consider the cost of their degrees, they just do what interests them.

Overall, it was an interesting article and hopefully this information has been informative.

I will be starting some small excursions this term as part of the Careers Program and information will come out about these soon. Small groups of ten will go on a few careersrelated adventures with all COVID safety measures in place before we leave for the excursion, while we are travelling and when at the venues.





School Travel

From January onwards, there will be a number of school Opal cards expiring, as the physical card has reached its lifespan.

These are cards for students who will be in years 8 to 12 in 2021, and only those Opal cards which haven't been replaced in the last five years.

Impacted students and/or their parent/guardian will be contacted directly by Transport for NSW via email or post. They will be asked to confirm their details online in order for a new School Opal card to be sent to the correct postal address in time for the new school year.

If contacted by Transport for NSW, details should be submitted online by December 1, 2020 at the latest. Affected students who do not confirm their details in time will have a new School Opal card posted to the address we currently have on file.

School Travel for 2021



2021 school travel applications are now open

Applications for student travel in 2021 opened from Monday 12 October 2020.

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass for 2021 can now apply online. A new application should be submitted if a student is applying for a school travel pass for the first time or requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who have changed school/campus, changed address, repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should re-apply or update their details.

*Applications must be completed by the student's parent or legal guardian if the student is aged under 16 years. Students 16 years and over must complete the application form themselves.

Where there is a change of distance eligibility based on a student's grade, the system will automatically update a student's entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new eligibility criteria, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is dies to expire will receive a notification advising them to reapply.

<u>Term Bus Pass</u> holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If a student needs to update their information or reapply, they should go online to

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2020 to ensure that current student

entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card remains valid. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2020, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2021.

Students residing in Rural and Regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the commencement of the new school year from their nominated operator, this may be distributed via the school or sent direct to their address. **Note**: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/Parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

New Concession Entitlement Cards

Transport for NSW will be replacing the below cards with Transport Concession Entitlement Cards (TCEC) from October 2020:

- Senior Secondary Student Concession Card (16 years and over) also used by Mature Secondary Students (18 years and over), Distance Education Students and Home School Students
- Proof of Age card (when a student under 16 years of age looks older)
- Boarder Rail Pass.

All previous cards will be valid until they expire. Students who require a Transport Concession Entitlement Card should speak with their school administration staff
