Deputy Principal's Report

Dear Parent / Carers,

Thank you to our school community who have supported us this term as we navigated through the "return to face-to-face" learning.

All students have received their semester 1 report. You would have seen that these are a simplified version of our normal reports. If you have any concerns about your child's progress please contact the school.

At this point for term 3, there will be the lifting of some restrictions. School sport and interschool competitions will commence. Students will now need to come to school in school uniform and change into their PE uniform for lessons. Tuesday is the only day students should be coming to school in PE uniform.

We will continue with our performing arts activities with safety protocols in place and some incursions that support the delivery of curriculum or involve allied health professionals will take place.

The following however remains on hold:

- School camps
- Excursions
- Parent attendance at assemblies & graduations
- School based activities that involve large gatherings of adults.

In line with this we will not be holding our junior school parent teacher evenings. Teachers who have concerns about any students have been asked to contact parents and we urge parents to do the same.

Parents and students in Year 12 have received information regarding the "end of term" activities and celebrations, and decisions will be made next term.

We continue to receive additional cleaning at school in line with the AHPPC guidelines, and whilst physical distancing of children is not required we will keeping sending strong messages regarding hygiene and appropriate behaviour.

School Attendance

All school students should be returning to school unless:

- they are currently unwell
- They have a medical certificate which states that they are unable to return to school due to an ongoing medical condition and the expected timeframe.

If a student is tested for COVID -19 please inform the school and keep them home until results have come through.

Lateness

We are very aware of the traffic and parking challenges that surround our school. We all need to take this in consideration in our travels to school to ensure that students are at school on time for the day by 8.25am.

There are a considerable amount of students who are late each day, many of these are students who walk to school and live nearby.

Please put some strategies in place to ensure students at school each day and on time.

The preferred payment method will continue to be online. Payments can also be made using Eftpos at the front office.

School resumes Term 3 for students on Tuesday 21st July. It will be an A Week timetable.

2020 International Competitions and Assessments for Schools (ICAS) – English and Spelling.

For over 30 years ICAS has been delivered to schools throughout Australia and in over 20 countries in Asia, Africa, the Pacific Region and USA. Your child is invited to participate in 2020.

All students receive a certificate and an individual student report indicating which questions they answered correctly and their score compared with the rest of the students tested. The tests are an excellent preparation for national tests and the student report is useful for highlighting your child's strengths and weaknesses.

High quality certificates are awarded for each year level as follows:

- High Distinction to the top 1% of entrants
- Distinction to the next 10% of entrants
- Credit to the next 25% of entrants
- Participation to all other participating student

There are TWO different tests students are able to sit to test their English and literacy skills:

ENGLISH TEST: entry fee for sitting the test is \$15.95 **GST INC**.

- Year 7 and Year 10 students -This test will take place on Monday the 24th August 2020 (3.00pm – 3.55pm)
- Year 8 and Year 9 students This test will take place on Tuesday the 25th August 2020 (3.00pm 3.55pm)

SPELLING TEST: entry fee for sitting the test is \$15.95 GST INC.

 Year 7 students ONLY - This test will take place on Monday 31st August 2020 (3.00pm - 3.55pm)

Permission notes can be collected from the English staffroom. They must be returned and online payments made by: 17th July, 2020.

(Payments will not be accepted at the front office)

PHS LITERACY NEWS! STAGE 6 WHOLE SCHOOL ACADEMIC WRITING PROJECT

Parramatta High School's **2020 Professional Learning Plan** places a significant focus on supporting teachers to develop and implement **effective teaching practices to improve students' literacy skills and achievement**. Staff data analysis of 2017-2019 HSC results identified the ongoing need to improve students' academic writing. As a result, the PHS Literacy Team, led by its Literacy Coordinator Ms Begg, have designed and are delivering a **Stage 6 Whole School Academic Writing Project**. This Project has so far included the delivery of professional learning sessions to all staff, as well as staff collaborative teacher planning sessions resulting in Stage 6 Literacy lessons and resources by all staff and across all Key learning Areas and Faculties.

Staff are extending their knowledge and skills to develop, extend and support academic writing amongst all senior students in preparation for students' HSC and tertiary academic studies. Teachers at Parramatta High are utilising CECE's What Works Best evidence-based practices such as explicit teaching of literacy and the Literacy Explicit Teaching and Learning Cycle Model. Their lessons will focus on developing students':

- sophisticated use of academic and subject specific vocabulary
- use of academic, formal voice
- ability to control their expression and create complex sentence structures
- ability to express complex conceptual arguments in topic sentences and extended response writing

Explicit teaching practices involve teachers clearly showing students what to do and how to do it. It also recognises that learning is a cumulative and systematic process, starting with building strong foundations in core literacy skills. Lessons developed and implemented will ensure Stage 6 (Year 11 and 12) students are given time and consistent teacher instruction to build students' field of knowledge, and to model exemplar responses and literacy skills, and then support students to jointly and independently construct their own exemplar written responses. The overall aim of the Stage 6 Academic Writing Project is to maximise students' literacy confidence and success in assessments and HSC examinations.

Watch this space for further news of the implementation and showcasing of this PHS whole school project, and teacher and student feedback on the effectiveness and success of its implementation.

Additional HSC student support

HSC students from NSW public schools now have access to the new DoE online platform – a home for *support* material, online lessons, practice exams, demonstrations, assessment resources and video lessons to supplement their existing coursework and strengthen their HSC success.

This hub provides HSC students with a quick and easy point of reference for questions they might have on anything relating to the HSC.

"A range of high quality, on-demand support modules will be progressively made available to students through the platform from the start of the July school holidays," stated Ms Sarah Mitchell, Minister for Education and Early Childhood Learning,

The HSC Hub solution was designed following a survey of HSC teachers through statewide staffrooms across NSW to determine what additional support teachers felt was required for HSC students and what form this support could take.

New material is being added regularly from both the department and external providers to make sure that students have the support they need this year.


