 - Varun Singh and Annabelle Aung






Year 6 Orientation Day



DEAR in 'action'

Check-in Assessment for Years 7-9

Years 7-9 students continue with their reading and numeracy Check-in Assessments, until the end of Week 10, to support schools to assess and monitor student learning and use the diagnostic data for future planning.

Students – don't forget to bring headphones or earbuds that plug into a computer to enable you to hear audio during the assessment. Earbuds used for mobile phones or other portable devices may be suitable for use during the assessment. The type of computer connection needed is a jack or USB. If your child needs headphones, the school will be able to provide them. Also, you are allowed and may wish to use a calculator for your numeracy assessment

NAPLAN Readiness Test

Next year's Year 7 and Year 9 students will be completing their NAPLAN tests online at school. As part of the preparation process for the school to transition to online testing, we are required to conduct a NAPLAN Readiness test this term. All current Y 7 students will be involved in this test. On Thursday 9th December they will sit a practice exam during Period1 or Period 2. The main purpose of this test is to check the capacity of our internet and other technology before the actual NAPLAN tests. Results will not be recorded or given to us, and students may not even be required to complete the whole test. Therefore, there is no need for students to prepare in any way or become anxious about the test. We do ask them to bring their own headphones if possible.

Next year's Year 7 and Year 9 students will have an opportunity to practice the online tests at school during first term.

NEWS SPORT KEY TOPICS

Reading Levels ▶ Green Orange Red



Kids News is a free, ready to go resource using current daily news stories for students. Articles are divided into three categories:

- 1. Key Topics
- 2. Sport
- 3. News

A traffic light system helps direct readers to appropriate content depending on reading level:

- Green Simple to medium vocab, story content easily understood, accessible to all readers (especially with audio option)
- Orange medium level of vocabulary, story content a little more complex (audio option and glossary available)
- Red contains complex vocabulary and content that is of a higher level, suited to more able readers.
